### What new facilities can Jolly Harbour residents look forward to?

"Residents can look forward to a host of exciting new facilities. We've designed a

new entrance, upgraded marina facilities, an entirely new commercial area with duty-free retail spaces, and new dining options along the boardwalk.

"We're also enhancing recreational areas with tennis and pickleball courts, a state-of-the-art athletic club, and improvements to the golf course. Additionally, new waterfront residences

will be built—all aimed at enhancing the living and visitor experience.

"It's an exciting time for Jolly Harbour, and we're eager to see these developments come to life!"

#### Will they all be open to the public?

"While some facilities may remain exclusive to residents, many will be open to the public, particularly retail and dining establishments."

#### What part are you most excited about?

"I'm looking forward to the new commercial centre and additional restaurants, which will significantly elevate the lifestyle experience in Jolly."

#### What's the timeline on all of this?

"Our catamaran haul-out and storage facility is already operational, and we're making excellent progress in several other key areas. Currently, we're focused on the development of the new entrance, the sporting facilities, marina office with restaurant, and administrative offices. All of these are on schedule to open within the next six months.






"In addition, we're developing 66,000 square feet of space dedicated to restaurants and duty-free retail. We're also building office spaces, with 11,000 square feet available for rent in the first phase. Phase one of this development is set to open in late 2025, with additional phases planned for 2026 and 2027.

"On the residential side, the waterfront development envisions 175 one, two and three-bedroom condominiums. The first phase will feature 60 condominium units, including 32 three-bedroom units, all of which are approved for citizenship by investment. We plan to start accepting presales in the coming months."

## What will the overhaul of the area mean for property prices?

"It is expected to boost property values in Jolly Harbour over the next few years which makes early investment highly advantageous. In addition to the work being done directly in Jolly Harbour, the surrounding area is also getting a boost with new residences and development





happening at Sugar Ridge and Nikki Beach opening on Jolly Beach in 2028. There's lots of activity all around us!

"The redevelopment has also generated substantial local employment opportunities in the construction industry, with teams of 30–40 people working daily. This work will continue for the next couple of years, and as the development nears completion, even more jobs will be created with the opening of additional retail establishments."

### Tell us a bit about what galvanised this project.

"The project was driven by a vision to modernise Jolly Harbour while maintaining its original charm. Our goal is to restore its former glory and recapture the unique vibe that so many of us fell in love with.

"On the residential side, the waterfront development envisions 175 one, two and three-bedroom condominiums. The first phase will feature 60 condominium units, including 32 three-bedroom units, all of which are approved for citizenship by investment. We plan to start accepting presales in the coming months."

ou already know our glorious twin isles offer abundant sunshine, a beach for every day of the year and some of the most spectacular scenery on Earth. But what about when it comes to investing your money here? There are a number of features that set Antigua and Barbuda apart from other Caribbean islands. Here are our top 10 reasons to choose here when purchasing a property or starting a business, so that you can be confident your capital will work for you.

#### Booming economy

Antigua and Barbuda has had the fastest-growing economy in the Caribbean archipelago in recent months. GDP was on track to surge by 6.3 percent by the end of 2024, with a healthy growth rate of 3.5 percent predicted by the IMF for 2025. Both inflation and national debt are also forecast to dip over the next 12 months. With record-breaking tourist arrivals – surpassing even pre-pandemic

stats – all signs point to a rosy financial future.

#### Easy communication

Don't be surprised to hear local dialect – an enchanting combo of broken English with some African verbiage thrown in to create a unique lexicon – but standard English is the prime language. The use of a key international language is beneficial for everything from negotiating a deal to making new friends.

#### Friendly people

Speaking of friends, ask any expat why they chose Antigua and most will tell you it was because of the people. Antiguans and Barbudans are welcoming and outgoing by nature and rarely pass up an opportunity to lend a helping hand to a newcomer in a fix. New residents will find it easy to build relationships, while the significant expat population has given the country a multicultural flair.

#### Stress-free travel

Geography gave Antigua and Barbuda its prime position in the centre of the Caribbean, but it was diligent networking and a savvy business approach that helped it become a regional hub. VC Bird International Airport welcomes daily direct flights from a multitude of destinations including the US, UK and Canada. October's opening of an international runway in Barbuda has made getting to the beautiful sister island, which has seen a wealth of foreign investment in recent years, easier too.

#### Gain citizenship

Investing in an approved real estate development gives the buyer the right to apply for an Antigua and Barbuda passport. The country offers one of the world's most attractive and affordable citizenship by investment programmes. Passport-holders benefit from visa-free





travel to around 150 countries worldwide, with no restriction on dual nationality, plus a slew of tax advantages such as no levy on worldwide income, inheritance or capital gains. Applications take just a few months to process.

#### Safe environment

Another major draw for investors – particularly those with young families – is the country's low crime rate. Antigua and Barbuda is one of the safest Caribbean islands and visitors consistently report feeling at ease here. The twin isles are politically stable too, and also boast a number of first-class private medical facilities and schools.

#### **Business-friendly**

Ok, we'll admit opening a bank account still requires you to produce an inordinate number of documents but efforts by the Central Bank are underway to address this. Banking red-tape aside,

foreign investors will find Antigua to be a hospitable environment with the government willing to offering concessions to those who meet the criteria. For example, the standard corporate tax rate is 25 percent but reductions may be granted depending on the level of capital investment and number of jobs to be created.

#### Convenient currency

As a member of the Eastern Caribbean Currency Union, Antigua and Barbuda is one of eight countries that uses the Eastern Caribbean dollar. This is pegged to the US dollar at a rate of EC\$2.70 to US\$1. The country has no foreign exchange controls or restrictions on capital repatriation. US dollars are also widely accepted nationwide for further convenience. Tip: always keep a nominal supply of cash on you as some small vendors don't accept plastic.

#### British-style laws

The twin islands benefit from a strong democratic form of government based on the UK's Westminster system. This also extends to robust protection for investors. Across the Caribbean and Latin American region, Antigua and Barbuda is ranked highly for enforcing contracts and protecting investors.

#### Plentiful activities

And finally, it would be remiss of us not to point out that it's not all work, work, work here. Whether entertaining a new business associate or just hanging with the fam, Antigua offers ample activities to keep nature lovers, watersports fans, history buffs and foodies alike occupied. # TRANSFORMING VILLA COBY

# HOW FINDING A GOOD REALTOR WAS JUST THE START OF ONE BUYER'S EXCITING INVESTMENT JOURNEY

mong the skills to be gleaned from 20 years in the real estate business is the ability to read a client and assess their needs – sometimes even before they have.

After meeting Shelley, Nadia had a hunch Villa Coby was the place for her.

"That's what our team does," Nadia says.
"We get to know the client and figure out the best fit for them."

Villa Coby was the last property Shelley was taken to see. Its spacious outdoor areas overlooking unspoilt tropical terrain made it an instant hit.

It was during that first meeting in November 2023 that Nadia made another







serendipitous suggestion. Should Shelley wish to refurbish her new home, La-Dana Ffrench – one of few women in the construction industry – was among Antigua's most respected contractors.

"There's not a lot of brand new properties on the market, so renovations have become very popular," Nadia explains.

"I had initially thought I was just going to focus on aesthetics, but as we moved along the process I realised that wasn't going to happen, I wanted to do more for the property," Shelley recalls.

She eventually opted for a complete renovation of every room in the house, including all three bathrooms, and replaced the outdoor deck with robust – and maintenance-free – concrete. The pool was given a fresh lease of life by altering its shape to allow for in-water lounging, and Shelley also switched from chlorinated to saltwater which is said to offer health benefits as well as minimising the pool's upkeep.

The addition of swings and abundant lounging chairs added a wistful, contemporary elegance. Shelley has also incorporated eye-catching feature walls and stylish lighting and fixtures for ambience,



while the transformation of the kitchen into a chef's space complete with breakfast bar has helped create a "cohesive" interior that will especially appeal to groups.

The entire overhaul took just four months from start to finish.

"Undertaking a project like this from overseas can be very difficult." Shelley says. "But La-Dana was amazing, sending me video updates, keeping me up to speed with everything and ensuring I felt a part of the process the whole way.

"It's so important to have a reliable team. La-Dana is excellent with timelines." The only delays were waiting for shipments of furniture.

"When you're kept informed, there's no reason to be upset about it," Shelley says.

"La-Dana was also great at giving me options," she continues. "Rather than just showing me the most high-end ideas, she really took the time to listen to me as a client and understand what I wanted, offering me a variety of choices so I could pick the best within my budget."

Villa Coby's striking new interior was enhanced by acclaimed Caribbean designer Charmaine Benjamin-Werth.

"Charmaine was recommended by a friend. When I met with her we clicked right away," Shelley explains. "I gave her an idea of

what I wanted my villa to look like, she gave me mood boards and we realised we were on the same page."

Villa Coby is now available for holiday rent and will particularly appeal to families and groups of friends.

"I absolutely love the house; the style is barefoot elegance," Shelley enthuses. "Every room is unique, but for me the backyard is the real selling feature. You walk onto the deck and see this oasis with lounging chairs, an outdoor shower, an outdoor bar, and gazebo for al fresco dining.

"This is the spot I know people will want to spend time in."

To anyone else considering investing in Antigua, Shelley has a few top tips.

"Find a great realtor like Nadia, and then a good construction and design team. Voice your opinions and take feedback from them as well.

"When it comes to your budget, make sure to stay within your parameters but at the same time don't be afraid to splurge occasionally, because sometimes those things you didn't spend money on might be what you later regret when a renter mentions it in a review," she says.

Asked if she'd do it again, Shelley is emphatic.

"I'd do it 100 times over," she smiles. "I'm

already thinking of buying another property and working with the same design team. This experience has only made me want to invest more."


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## INSPIRING INTERIORS

# CELEBRATED DESIGNER CHARMAINE BENJAMIN-WERTH TALKS MOOD BOARDS, THE IMPORTANCE OF LIGHTING – AND HOW BARBIE HELPED IGNITE HER CAREER

ou could say Charmaine Benjamin-Werth's destiny as an interior designer was laid out for her. On the floor of her childhood home to be precise.

It was there, as a little girl growing up in Antigua, that the first blueprints of the houses she imagined were forged, a nascent talent given life on the 12-inch squared tiles of her parents' verandah.

Her right-hand woman, conventionally enough, was Barbie. But rather than being enchanted by the doll's frocks and purses, it was the stylish settings in which Barbie and her PVC pals might hang that enthralled her.

"I had lots and lots of Barbies. I didn't care about them or their fashion; I cared about their homes," Charmaine smiles. "I'd use a different floor tile to represent their



bedroom, their living room.

"I'd move my mother's furniture all over the house. She'd ask me what was going on, and I'd say, I just redid your bedroom," she adds with a laugh.

Fast forward a few decades and Charmaine is still drawn to transforming private residences.

Her flair can be seen everywhere from the straight-from-a-magazine homes of Sugar Ridge to several of the picture-perfect properties that line Jolly Beach.

"Most of my work is residences renovations and new builds. I also do restaurants, bars, even commercial spaces, but my favourite is homes because you get to interact with people, meet the family, see them grow," she says.





"That's been a lot of fun."

Charmaine honed her skills at university in the US, and for the last 20 years has worked alongside husband and acclaimed architect Kerry Werth.

She recently lent her discerning eye to four-bedroom Villa Coby in Harbour View, a short stroll from Antigua's west coast. She was enlisted by the property's new owner Shelley Challenger who wanted her help creating a captivating crib for holiday rentals.

"That was a fun project. The client was really, really pleased. The place is unrecognisable compared to what she bought," Charmaine says.

"The pool is spectacular. It now has a lounge pad with seats in it and the deck around the pool looks amazing.

"When you walk in, it's open-plan. Shelley wanted it to look Caribbean so we redid the ceilings; although it's not open rafters we made it look like open rafters.

"The addition of wallpaper and new lighting changes everything. It looks completely different. She's very pleased and so am I."

It's not purely the aesthetics that Charmaine handles for clients. She also takes care of the all-important sourcing of furniture from overseas, the shipments and deliveries, and even the plumbing and electrics. Materials are usually ordered online but Charmaine does, on occasion, travel alongside clients who prefer to view what they are buying before doing so.

For those hiring Charmaine for the first time, there is one question she routinely prioritises.

"I ask to see pictures of what they like. But even more importantly, I want to see pictures of what they don't like," she explains. "Most of the time, people don't really know what they like."

That's where Charmaine's expertise really comes into its own, with the creation of mood boards showing colours and concepts, textures and textiles a client might not have considered.

"There are certain things that would work in North America or Europe that would not work in Antigua," she continues.

The next stage is to create a floor plan before designing a to-scale layout, complete with suggested furniture placement.

Charmaine then turns her attention to the lighting, air flow and finishes. The final stage is adding artwork, plants and appliances.

"We do a lot of outdoor living here so I really like doing outdoor and indoor lighting as well as outdoor furniture," she says.

There's a particular art to identifying optimum lighting, an aspect she believes is

critical, and often overlooked.

"Lighting is really, really important. It's everything. I highly recommend warm lighting, warm LEDs, because it's cosy, it makes a place look lived in," she explains.

"It's not necessarily as modern as modernists want but, for island living, warm lighting is fantastic."

We've put together our top tips for how to live more sustainably and ease your carbon conscience.

#### Avoid plastics...

Antigua and Barbuda was ahead of the game in reducing waste when it became the first country in Latin America and the Caribbean to ban single-use plastic bags in 2016. Sadly, supermarkets didn't get the green memo and still blithely offer them in the fresh produce section. Do you really need a plastic bag to

transport your bananas to the check-out? As for buying pre-chopped produce in a plastic box, don't make us slap your hand, people.

#### Choose home-grown...

Speaking of fresh fruit and veg, what are you doing in the supermarket anyway? Patronising roadside stalls bursting with seasonal offerings is not only better for the environment, it helps local vendors and the economy too. Plus, home-grown tomatoes, avocadoes, melons and potatoes taste a whole lot better than carbon footprint-boosting, artificially-ripened imports that have been languishing in a shipping container.

#### Recycle...

If you ever need a reminder of what happens to the bulk of our waste in Antigua, take a trip to the Cooks dumpsite: a sprawling, spontaneous-igniting, noxious gas-emitting graveyard of non-biodegradable trash. Thankfully, there are a few local groups like Good Humans 268 and the Antigua & Barbuda Waste Recycling Corp battling valiantly to reduce the problem through recyclables collection services. Glass, plastics and cans are among the materials that can be picked up, processed and repurposed.






#### Ditch meat...

'Veganism' may have been replaced by the more palatable 'plant-based', but the central ethos is the same. More and more people each year are ditching meat on both environmental and health grounds. Research carried out by Oxford University in 2023 showed that plant-based diets resulted in 75 percent less climate-heating emissions, water pollution and land use than their meatmunching counterparts. Veganuary, anyone?

#### Refill...

Don't want to trust the tap water for drinking? That might be sensible. What is not is purchasing endless bottles from the store. Plastic water bottles take around 1,000 years to decompose, while leaking pollutants into the environment along the way. Onegallon and five-gallon containers can be filled at water stations found across the island. Or save time and hassle by signing up with a local firm who will deliver them directly to you.





#### Repair...

Antiguans and Barbudans are naturally resourceful people. Before you throw away that toaster that's lost its spring or those shoes that are as soulless as a Trump rally speech it's definitely worth seeing if they can be repaired first. The nation is home to a wealth of fix-it pros who can likely restore them to their former glory for a nominal fee.

#### Cvcle

Break the four-wheel habit and trying cycling occasionally instead of driving. In addition to the health benefits and the free endorphin buzz, your zero emission jaunt is the best way to experience the sights and sounds of the island. Think there are no traffic jams in Antigua? Think again. You've earned the smug smirk as you manoeuvre past those queued cars backed up due to a fender bender. Just watch out for potholes.

#### Compost...

Around 30 percent of what we throw away each week is made up of yard waste and food scraps, which can be composted instead. Just like the bits we eat, the food that's discarded contains valuable minerals and nutrients that can be returned to soil and recycled back into the ecosystem. Food that ends up in landfill

has to break down without oxygen, which produces greenhouse gases and contributes to global warming. So grab a container and get started.

#### Solar...

One thing that's never in short supply is sunshine. Still, little more than five percent of the country's electricity currently comes from solar power. Efforts are afoot to change that; Antigua's first utility-scale solar power plant started operations in 2019 and incentives for private sector investment have also borne fruit with a handful of entities now offering a full service from design to installation.

#### Volunteer...

If you really want to make a difference, roll up your sleeves and pitch in. There are a number of local non-profits who would be delighted with some additional manpower. The Environmental Awareness Group (EAG) welcomes volunteers for everything from counting birds for its censuses to patrolling beaches on the lookout for nesting sea turtles. An extra pair of hands will also be welcomed by Adopt-a-Coastline, which does a sterling job keeping beaches trash-free and reducing erosion through tree-planting exercises.





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# SHIFTING MINDSETS ON DISABILITY: HOW ONE WOMAN'S ADVERSITY BECAME A CATALYST FOR CHANGE

ith her infectious enthusiasm and boundless energy, you'd be forgiven for thinking Joshuanette Francis had been the beneficiary of all of life's blessings. In fact, hers is a story of adversity and an exhausting fight for justice, culminating in a crusade to help others.

Her positive spirit, she says, is one that "took years" to achieve.

Receiving a diagnosis of a disability can be devastating for anyone. Joshuanette was just 24 when, in 2014, the stiffness, aches and pains she was experiencing were confirmed to be arthritis. By the time she hits 40, the cartilage in her knees is expected to have entirely degenerated.

She says the condition ultimately cost her her job as a restaurant supervisor, heralding a domino effect of misfortune from the loss of her mortgage to her mental health as she spiralled into depression.

Several years later, the mother-of-one has transformed those setbacks into stepping stones to a brighter future for other people with physical challenges.

In 2023, Joshuanette's non-profit organisation Good Humans 268 was born. Its mission is to champion the rights of those with disabilities through partnerships and programmes that in turn help protect the planet too.

"Arthritis is not a major disability; you don't look at me and think I'm disabled, so you can only imagine what it's like for someone with a visible one," she tells Luxury Locations Magazine.

Joshuanette lost her job four years ago

after bosses apparently claimed her health was "concerning", paving the way for a lengthy battle for compensation.

"Since then I've heard so many stories of people being taken advantage of. Fighting is exhausting, you spend hours of your life in meetings. But now, I am grateful for it because it's taught me a lot.

"I still struggle," she admits. "I lost a lot that I will never get back. My positivity did not happen overnight; it took years."

Something Joshuanette realised was essential for her wellbeing was a forum in which to share her experiences.

Good Humans 268 also serves as a vital community for people with disabilities.

"People tell you that you will cope, that you will get past it," she explains. "But you only do if you talk about it."

At the core of the NGO's work is a recycling programme that began with the installation of bins in local schools. Today, Good Humans has placed almost 300 recycling receptacles in dozens of schools across the country, diverting nearly one million containers from the national dump site.

Processing the hundreds of thousands of cans and bottles creates jobs for people with disabilities who are hired for tasks such as installing and emptying the bins, washing the containers and removing caps.

Last summer, Good Humans joined forces with a number of Carnival event organisers to collect food and drink trash in a bid to make the annual festivities greener. The team even wore eco-friendly gloves and used reusable laundry bags instead of plastic to transport the garbage to their John Hughes recycling facility.

Joshuanette plans to expand operations further by providing private homes and businesses with recycling bins which will be emptied weekly free of charge.

"There will be an educational component to this too," she explains. "We will educate people about waste separation, such as through workshops."

Equity advocacy is central to the organisation's ethos.

Despite the Disabilities and Equal Opportunities Act being passed in 2017, several of its provisions are yet to take effect



 one of them being a disability tribunal to assist those who feel they have been unfairly dismissed.

"I would encourage everyone to read the Act; there are so many different things in it that still need to come to fruition," Joshuanette says.

"We have to change the way we do things; disabled people must be able to do the things everyone else takes for granted - get jobs, acquire land.

"I am so excited by what I know Good Humans can achieve. I have prayed for the spirit of Job; even in bad situations I have been looking for the light."

Within a decade, Joshuanette's ambitious plans include securing a 50-acre site for the group's multi-faceted enterprises.

"I am aiming for 35 acres for a farm, five for a nursery and 10 for a state-of-the-art compound to serve as a home away from home for people with disabilities, complete with a gym, swimming pool and theatre.

"We will showcase items we have made out of recycled aluminium, glass and plastic. We will become a tourist attraction," she enthuses. "People will have jobs, there will be no more gloom and doom when we talk about people with disabilities, the future will be bright."





These days, while Joshuanette has largely come to terms with her personal plight, the driving force behind Good Humans' work is the dividends it reaps for others.

The little girl whose wheelchair use meant she was unable to do something as simple as use the bathroom unassisted at her primary school is one Joshuanette will never forget. The quest for that small dignity inspired

Good Humans' Project Red which aims to make Antigua's schools more accessible.

"The child had been there since kindergarten with no access to a bathroom. Now we have a bathroom she is able to use," Joshuanette beams.

"That's what keeps us going – the little feeling of glory you get when things work out."

Joshuanette, who now works in the public sector in addition to running the NGO, believes "the world doesn't work unless people are giving".

"I grew up not dirt poor, we weren't hungry, but I know what it's like to struggle and now I'm in a position to help I feel I have to maximise that," she explains.

"Caring for the environment has been a part of who I am since I was a girl; I grew up wanting to protect it and now I want to protect it for my son too," she says, adding: "There is no planet B; we have to look after the one we are on."

# ART GALLERY THAT CREATES A SCENE



Gilly Gobinet's enchanting space stirs the senses and captivates the soul

et among tropical gardens overlooking a seductive seascape, Gilly Gobinet's working Art Gallery offers scenes as pretty as a picture. And that's before one even begins to browse the delightful paintings on display.

Inside, one wall is devoted to an effervescent collection of paintings in acrylic of tropical flora and fauna such as bougainvillea, hibiscus, pelicans and turtles.

Gilly is one of few artists on the island who specialises in watercolours. These adorn the walls in both figurative and semi-abstract styles.

Barely a square foot of Gilly's gallery in Needs Must Circle, Fitches Creek – a short drive from the international airport – has been excluded from this bacchanalia of colour and canvas. Hand-painted murals adorn exterior walls and even the periphery of the swimming pool.

"Inspiration is never lacking when you're surrounded by all of this," she says brightly, gesturing towards her verdant garden and the ocean beyond.

Anyone wishing to browse Gilly's sundry creations will be treated to a full tour of the property, beginning with the gaily embellished hallway before heading

into the bathroom which also houses several pieces. Hundreds more original works in all shapes and sizes, displayed for sale, bedeck the interior rooms, verandah and courtyard. The latter is where Gilly can usually be found at work, brush in hand.

"Most artists are recognisable by one specific style but I am extremely versatile," she says. "I can do anything from cartoons, to delicate pen and ink, to very detailed or loose watercolour and acrylic – practically anything anyone asks me to."

While most of the pieces exhibited are the result of her own impulse, much of Gilly's work is commissioned, particularly her pet portraits for which she donates 10 per cent to local animal charity Dogs and Cats of Antigua. Nearly all her paintings are suitcase-friendly, or can be shipped already stretched or rolled into a tube for convenience. Colourful greetings cards are also available.

# RICARDO DRUE:

# THE ANTIGUAN-BORN STAR WHO STAMPED HIS NAME ON THE REGION'S HEARTS

ad anyone been able to foretell the tragedy that would unfold before the release of Ricardo Drue's 2024 Carnival hit it's doubtful the lyrics could have been much more poignant.

His posthumously released single 'Ah Love it Here' – an ode to the annual festivities – was as roguishly buoyant and anthemic as ever, but with the gut-wrenchingly apropos line "I won't be coming back home".

What he has to say won't be easy, he warns us.

"I confess that I love to roam," the lyrics continue. "And I've found a place where I feel at home – out here on the road."

The song was one of around a dozen that were to comprise his latest album 'My Year', a year in which he planned to break the notoriously tough and ferociously competitive Trinidadian music scene.

Sadly, it was not to be.

On 12 December 2023, the Caribbean entertainment world was momentarily hushed into silence as news broke that one of its brightest stars had died at just 38 years old. Drue, a young man whose dynamism and vigour reverberated on stage, was no more.



"It's been tough," his mother, veteran journalist and TV producer Nicola Barriteau, tells Luxury Locations Magazine.

"I rise empty, go to sleep empty, there are pockets of empty throughout the day. I am digging deep, feeling like I am lost.

"I felt like I was lost this morning," she adds as she sips coffee under the amber lighting of an Antiguan café.

Still, it will take more than his passing to

snuff out Drue's light. Barriteau is determined to keep it flickering through the Ricardo Barriteau Drue Foundation which she launched last summer.

The non-profit's raison d'être is ostensibly to help Antiguan youngsters get a foothold in the entertainment industry through workshops in arts, dance and drama. But its real work goes deeper by building less obvious but crucial skills like public speaking, while boosting children's confidence and self-esteem.

It was those aspects, Barriteau explains, that particularly resonated with Drue. He had long dreamed of creating a platform to help aspiring performers avert some of the challenges and demons he had battled himself while trying to forge a path in the cutthroat sector, she says.

Caribbean islands may share commonalities in culture and history. But each has its unique identity, fiercely guarded by its own tiny community, resulting in a nationalistic, and often nepotistic, flavour.

For Drue – born in Antigua and raised in Trinidad, before moving to Florida at the age of 14 – making his mark as a flag-wielding Caribbean singer was a steep hill to climb.



"His identification was always an issue," Barriteau says. "Who are you? Where are you from? It's an issue because you're Trini and you're singing in Antigua, it's an issue because you're Antiguan and you're singing in Trinidad.

"So that was a battle that he faced; he had to stamp his name."

That struggle would give rise to one of Drue's most successful hits – 2016's footstomping 'ID: Stamp Yuh Name' – earning him his third of four Party Monarch crowns in the yearly Antigua Carnival celebrations.

Whatever obstacles he faced, internally or externally, he never let it show on stage. Drue was renowned for his surefooted professionalism and meticulously crafted performances, whether the kooky, schoolyard-themed 'Hide and Seek' or the stylish, futuristic motif of 'Another Level'.

His sense of humour was a recurrent thread and dates all the way back to childhood, Barriteau smiles.

"I can still see him at the top of the stairs with a pot spoon in his hand. It was a ritual every afternoon after school, he and his little brother singing some stupidness," she says. "Ricardo just felt he was a comedian, he was a prankster, a joker."

It was on stage in Antigua in July 2022 where Drue proposed to long-time girlfriend, acclaimed Trinidadian soca singer Patrice Roberts, with whom he had one of his five children. The pair were due to tie the knot last year.

"He loved kids. He always wanted to make sure they were safe, protected and given an opportunity to shine," Barriteau continues. "From way back, he had a difficult time and was more or less the underdog. He had to fight to find a place – whether it was singing with the choir when he was little or the calypso competition he entered when he was eight or nine. He didn't win and he was so, so sad."





As a teenager living with his father in Florida, Drue formed a pop and soca band called Crossover, before returning to his mother's native Trinidad determined to break onto the music scene.

"It was difficult for him because he was a new face and, as Caribbean people, we don't embrace what we deem as outsiders. Trinidad is a heavy duty clique and they would say, who is this little red man trying to come into our space?

"Because I worked in television and radio he felt I had ways and means to get him in there. But I always said to him, I do not want to be the reason that you are successful, you have to do it for you. I remember we clashed over that," Barriteau recalls.

"He thought I didn't want to help him but it gave him the drive. He pushed and pushed and pushed, and he did it."

It is thanks to musicians like Drue and Roberts that Caribbean soca – a portmanteau of soul and calypso – is today appreciated far beyond the region's sun-soaked shores. Each summer sees a slew of fresh faces on the archipelago's Carnival stages, all hoping to stamp their name in the arena.

"Because he had a hard time infiltrating the market, and sometimes not having the support of the industry, Ricardo wanted to create a space for kids to learn music, dance, all forms of arts.

"After his passing I felt it was important that we do that," Barriteau explains.

The foundation's first series of workshops – for 25 young people aged seven to 17 – took place last August.

"We had six or seven sessions and focused

on character building, with the aim of getting them to understand who they are, what they want to do and where they're going.

"The plan going forward is for state-ofthe-art studios with a theatre. We want to create the next generation of doers, movers and shakers.

"In addition to empowering young people and building their confidence, it adds to Antigua's social fabric by creating new niches to help with country building too.

"We want to create a generation with positive fire in their eyes, a powerful generation that will not just do, but do for good, do for better, do for country."

As for Drue, "his legacy is still being written", Barriteau believes.

"Through this foundation and what we plan to do in his name, his story is still being told.

"I would like him to be remembered for his warmth, his humility. He was a giver, he was a protector and he was real."

Rihanna's 'Shine Bright Like a Diamond' plays on the café's sound system as Barriteau speaks. It's unlikely the symbiosis is lost on either of us.

Drue's ultimate ambitions may have been cut brutally short but his eponymous non-profit will go some way to ensuring that those who come after him are equipped with a toolbox with which to reach theirs.

That's where his legacy will be cemented. Because, as the lyrics to 'Ah Love it Here' foretold, he is already immortalised on the road.

# MY ANTIGUA: CARRACK JONES

He's already set a world record by sailing solo from Antigua to St Maarten – the punishing 100-mile journey being the longest distance ever sailed in an Optimist dinghy – and captained a crew of youth sailors who won the legacy class at Antigua Sailing Week 2024. And he's still just 15 years old. But Carrack Jones won't be resting on his laurels anytime soon. Meet the tenacious Antiguan teen determined to continue to make waves.

# When did you start sailing?

I've been sailing since I was a baby and my dad put me on a boat in a car seat. I sailed Optimist dinghies [small, single-handed boats designed for children] until I was 15 and I have done four international regattas – the Optimist World Championships in Turkey (2022), the Opti Worlds in Spain (2023), the North American Optis in Antigua (2023), and the North American Optis in Puerto Rico (2024). I sailed for Antigua, with four other people, each time. My proudest accomplishment is setting the world record when I sailed to St Maarten in November 2023.

# What do you love most about sailing?

I love the feeling of being on the water. I like sailing with other people, like at Sailing Week when we won; I was skippering, and there was also my brother Tyden, and [fellow youth sailors] Mia (Duce), Cosmo (Brookes), Isla (Brookes), Dylan Meade, Link (Beswick) and Imani (John-Polanco). It was fun. My dad and his friend Wage Derrick were there looking over us but they weren't allowed to help us.

# What's the most important lesson you've learned while sailing?

I've learned that team work is a good thing even though I'm not very good at it (laughs), but you have to work as a team on the water. Sportsmanship is also a really big thing; it's the number two rule in sailing.

I learned to sail at the Antigua Yacht Club but you can't really be taught team work and sportsmanship; you have to learn them yourself.

# How do you stay calm when you find yourself in a tricky situation at sea?

I am always calm on the water. I know what to do in tricky situations because I have 10 years of experience, so basically everything has already happened to me. Like when you have the spinnaker mixed up, you know what ropes to pull to bring it back in. But if there was one thing I would say to myself in my head it would be, just do it, do what you need to do and don't look back. While I have never been scared on the water, I have been sick. I get horrible seasickness. I can't go downstairs on a boat until I've spent three days on it – and then I get land sick when I get off again.



If you're sailing near land, you just have to look at the land to stop the sickness. But otherwise there's nothing much you can do.

# Any advice for other young people thinking of getting into sailing?

It will feel horrible at the start but you have to push through that because there are levels to it, and the first level is where you start.

If you start on Optis, you will feel bored at the start and at the end, but in between it's a fun time.

It's the people you hang out with that make it fun.

## What's your ultimate goal?

To sail around the world; I want to go to every single coastal country. And maybe hitchhike through Europe and Asia – that would be sick. But only after I get my financial situation sorted out. I hope to go to Canada for college. I want to do three years of business studies and then try and start a business here in Antigua – invest in some properties and rent them out.

# Favourite food? Movie?

My favourite food is shawarma. As for the movie I can't talk about it (grins). That's part of the movie, you can't talk about it: Fight Club.

# What's your earliest memory of Antigua?

Getting my cat Tiger. She's about 48 in cat years. She just appeared at our house. I asked my dad if I could keep her and he said, let's see if she turns up again. She came back the next day.

# What makes you proud to be Antiguan?

I think our island is beautiful. It's a great place to be. I love Antigua for what it is. Everyone knows each other and everyone is so nice. Most people are so appreciative of what they have and I understand that.
